



Resolution of the Announcement to Award the Prize for Best Bachelor's Degree Final Project on Planetary Wellbeing 2024

Given the rules governing the awarding of the Prize in Planetary Wellbeing in the Best Bachelor's Degree Final Project and Best Master's Degree Final Project categories, approved by the Governing Council of 27 April 2022 and modified by agreement of the Governing Council of 17 April 2024.

I hereby RESOLVE:

FIRST. To invite public applications for the Prize for Best Bachelor's Degree Final Project on Planetary Wellbeing 2024.

SECOND. The competition adheres to the regulations governing the awarding of the Prize for Planetary Wellbeing in the Best Bachelor's Degree and Best Master's Degree Final Project categories (<https://seuelectronica.upf.edu/bases-del-premi-en-benestar-planetari-en-les-modalitats-del-millor-tfg-i-tfm>), approved by the Governing Council of 27 April 2022 and modified by agreement of the Governing Council of 17 April 2024.

1. Financial award

The financial award of the prize of the ESCI-UPF UNESCO Chair in Life Cycle and Climate Change and the UPF for Best Bachelor's Degree Final Project in Planetary Wellbeing is provided by ESCI-UPF and UPF.

One first prize and two second prizes will be awarded.

A first prize of 1,000 € will be awarded. The winning person or team will receive this amount, minus the legally required tax deductions, and an honorary diploma, which will be presented at a public award ceremony.

Two second prizes of 500 € each will be awarded. The winning person or team will receive this amount, minus the legally required tax deductions, and an honorary diploma, which will be presented at a public award ceremony.

2. Purpose of the competition

The purpose of the competition is to award the Prize for Best Bachelor's Degree Final Project to those projects which contribute towards developing new knowledge in one of the topic areas related to Planetary Wellbeing.

3. Entry eligibility

In accordance with the second regulation, anyone who has submitted a Bachelor's Degree Final Project to UPF or ESCI-UPF during the 2023-2024 academic year which:

- Is an original project which was given a minimum grade of 8,5 in the first instance.

- Has used one of the following languages: Catalan, Spanish or English.
- Uses non-sexist and non-patriarchal language.

4. Application submission and deadlines

Applications must be addressed to the University Sustainability, Support and Commitment Service (SACU).

Electronic submissions are preferred. These should be sent by attaching the application form to the electronic General Instance form (<https://apps.upf.edu/TramitsExterns/?id=INGE>), which can be found on the UPF online office in the list of procedures and processes (https://wblapps5.upf.edu/gmp/cataleg_procediments).

This electronic General Instance form must be completed with the following details:

- In the "I hereby REQUEST" section: **Sol·licitud per al Millor Treball de Fi de Grau (TFG) en Benestar Planetari 2024** (*in lower case and in Catalan, as written*).
- the body or service to whom the application is addressed: **SERVEI DE SOSTENIBILITAT, ATENCIÓ I COMPROMÍS UNIVERSITARIS** (*in capital letters and in Catalan, as written*).

Applications can also be submitted in person at the UPF General Registry together with the supporting documentation. The application must be original and must be signed by hand (photocopies and electronically signed forms are not permitted for applications submitted in person).

Applications can also be submitted at any of the places stipulated in Article 16.4 of Law 39/2015 of 1st October, on the common administrative procedures of all public administrations.

The application form for both individual and group projects will be available on the UPF's Social Engagement and Sustainable Development website, in the "Prizes and announcements" section (<https://www.upf.edu/web/responsabilitat-social/premis-i-convocatories>).

The project must be submitted in whichever format is most appropriate (PDF, multimedia, plan, prototype, URL link, etc.), and must be anonymous. Each project must be accompanied by a project summary with a maximum of 500 words, also anonymous.

Submission of the application means that applicants accept the rules and regulations of this competition.

Any applications not registered within the period established in the competition regulations will not be admitted. Applications lacking the required documentation will not be admitted.

UPF can request that applicants provide complementary information that they may consider necessary to clarify or give further details about the project content.

The application deadline is the 9th of September.

5. Evaluation of applications

Article 8 of the [regulations](#) defines the following general evaluation criteria:

- Topic relevance and originality of development (25 points)
- Theoretical framework used (25 points)
- Coherence and methodological rigor (25 points)
- Results, conclusions and advancements contributing to the field of Planetary Wellbeing studies (25 points)

The minimum score to receive this Award is 60 points and 50% of the score, at least, in each of the four criteria mentioned above. The prize can be declared a desert.

6. Direction and resolution of the competition

In accordance with Article 6 of the regulations, to the University Sustainability, Support and Commitment Service (SACU) will direct and manage the competition process. The body responsible for resolving the competition will be the rector.

7. Assessment Committee

The Assessment Committee described in article 7 of the regulations is made up of the following members:

- Eva Pujadas Capdevila, vice-rector of Social Commitment and Sustainability of the UPF, or the person to whom she delegates, who will be the president, according to the appointment of the rector of the UPF, dated May 27, 2024
- Carla Lancelotti, director of the UPF Center for Planetary Studies on Planetary Wellbeing, as appointed by the rector of UPF, dated May 27, 2024
- Lela Mélon, member of the Faculty with experience in Planetary Wellbeing studies, as appointed by the rector of the UPF, dated May 27, 2024
- Ariadna Moreno Gay, technician related to the Center for Studies on Planetary Wellbeing of the UPF, according to appointment of the rector of the UPF, dated May 27, 2024

8. Competition resolution schedule

The prizewinners will be decided in the month of October.

The competition resolution will be published on the Social Engagement and Sustainable Development web page (<https://www.upf.edu/web/responsabilitat-social>) and the winning applicant will be advised by email.

9. Personal data protection

The purpose of personal data collection throughout this competition is its management for the awarding of prizes, and it will be done in accordance with (EU) General Data Protection Regulation 2016/679 and with Organic Law 3/2018 of 5th December, on personal data protection and the guaranteeing of digital rights. Universitat Pompeu Fabra is likewise responsible for processing this data. Carrer de la Mercè, 10. 08002 Barcelona.

All personal data will be kept for the duration of the competition and for as long as legal liabilities may apply. Nevertheless, information about the beneficiaries will be shown on the University website in accordance with the current transparency legislation, and may also appear in publicity material related to the winning projects.

Legitimation: Public interest mission (in accordance with Article 92 of Organic Law 6/2001 about universities).

Personal data will be processed by Pompeu Fabra University and will not be given to third parties, except in cases provided for by law.

Participants in the competition may exercise their rights of access, rectification, objection, deletion, restriction and portability, by following the procedures described at <https://www.upf.edu/web/proteccio-dades/drets>.

Objection to the processing of personal data, to the extent to which this may be incompatible with managing competition applications, constitutes withdrawal from the competition or from receiving the award.

Those concerned may contact the UPF data protection officer (dpd@upf.edu) if they believe that their rights have not been duly respected. In the event that they are not satisfied, they are entitled to lodge a complaint with the Catalan Data Protection Authority (<https://apdcat.gencat.cat/>).

THIRD. Those wishing to contest this resolution, which thereby concludes the administrative route, can bring a judicial appeal before the Barcelona Judicial Court (Jutjat Contenciós Administratiu de Barcelona) within a period of two months from the day following publication of this resolution, in accordance with Articles 8 and 46 of Law 29/1998, of 13th July, governing contentious-administrative jurisdiction.

Those concerned can also bring an appeal for review before the body responsible for the resolution within a period of one month from the day following publication, in accordance with provisions in Articles 123 and 124 of Law 39/2015 of 1st October, on the common administrative procedures of all public administrations. In this case a judicial appeal is not permitted until the discretionary appeal for review has been resolved or until the appeal has been deemed unsuccessful due to no notification or communication being received by the appellant.
